Descriptive Title of Project:

Smile Keepers staff plans to provide bi-annual dental screenings and bi-annual fluoride varnish applications for approximately 500 children 0-5 each year over the four year grant period. Smile Keepers also plans to provide dental education workshops for approximately 75 parents and/or caregivers annually during prenatal and parent workshops. Additionally, Smile Keepers is planning to provide educational opportunities for families through **outreach** activities. These activities may include education during story times at local library locations and during parent meetings with Head Start. Additional staff trainings may be provided for Special Education preschool providers, Head Start teachers and staff along with private preschool teachers and staff over the 4 year period. Smile Keepers also plans to work closely with program partners in development of media tools such as video development and social media promotion such as radio announcements, Facebook page sharing for information distribution and training opportunities.

Smile Keepers plans to continue working with First 5 to help connect families needing financial assistance for dental treatment to the Dental Help Fund on an annual basis. Approximately 1-3 families receive financial assistance each year to help offset costs of dental treatment. This information is tracked and documented. Additionally, Smile Keepers plans to provide outreach services while attending health fairs, kindergarten registrations and volunteer events. It is anticipated that an additional 100 children and or caregivers may be reached during these events. Documentation of attendance will be provided and noted.

Based on your answers above, provide a description of the service strategies you propose to use to effectively meet these desired outcomes.

Description: Smile Keepers plans to continue the current preschool dental program of twice yearly dental screenings, fluoride varnish applications, and dental education for approximately 500 children per year. Dental referrals are provided for children with moderate to urgent needs. Follow up phone calls to families are provided when necessary and all families receive notification of screening results. These notification letters are sent home with the child on the day of service. All services are provided at the school site and with written parent permission. These services are provided by the Smile Keepers staff of dental professionals. Smile Keepers also plans to provide preventive dental education for families attending childbirth education classes at Adventist Health Sonora. We plan to target at least 75 parents per year for these services. Each participating family receives an infant oral care bag. This customized bag has good quality oral hygiene products for baby and new parents. Follow up postcards at baby's 6-month milestone and 1 year birthday are sent to parents, reminding parents about starting

fluoride drops, wiping out baby's mouth daily, first tooth care, and first dental visit. Each postcard reminds parents to be a good role model for oral care. This has been a very popular and effective method in reaching new parents while increasing their own awareness about good oral care during pregnancy and post-partum oral care.

Smile Keepers also plans to add a strong outreach /training component. Recently, Smile Keepers received a request from the perinatal supervisor in the labor and delivery department of Adventist Health Sonora, to provide a training module for the nursing staff about infant oral care and how to educate new parents leaving the hospital. This training was specifically targeted for parents that did not attend birthing classes. The training was well received by the nursing staff. Through this training, we discussed the option (to develop a strategy) to include infant oral care instructions in the home baby care video shown to new parents before being discharged from the hospital. This opportunity would provide information for new parents and reinforce dental information to parents that have attended birthing classes. Topics covered in the video include feeding tips, caring for the umbilical cord, bathing tips and soon infant oral care!!! Plans are underway to meet and develop the script for a new video. This will be a wonderful opportunity to promote First 5 messages and increase awareness of infant oral care.

Smile Keepers also plans to provide trainings for staff in Head Start and Special Education preschool settings on how to implement and utilize efficient methods of group brushing and oral hygiene modeling. Customized brushing techniques and scheduling strategies will be developed for special needs children as well as possible adaptive tools for successful self-driven brushing. ie: large handle toothbrushes, soft sponge brushes, etc. Smile Keepers staff has extensive experience with special needs children and is familiar with providing instruction for staff to help implement strategies. Additional oral health education is necessary because there are greater challenges for children with certain developmental, emotional, physical, cognitive, or medical conditions. Children may have dental anxiety, sensory likes and dislikes, difficulties with fine motor skills, and other physical limitations can make brushing and flossing difficult. Brushing teeth is an unpleasant experience for special needs students with sensory defensiveness. As a result, these students have a higher risk of developing oral diseases ranging from gum disease to cavities. Since children's dental health is so closely tied to their overall health, preventing and promptly treating any issues are extremely important.

By providing training to teachers and assistants in oral health, as well as varied behavioral and dental techniques, preschool special education programs will help increase oral health awareness and will help create educational opportunities in the classrooms. These educational experiences will help children overcome a fear of the dentist, become familiar with oral examination procedures, establish oral hygiene routines, reduce sensory defensiveness or oral sensitivity, and reduce anxiety of the dentist.

An early childhood specialist (dental consultant) will also provide assistance and program support with these trainings. Smile Keepers plans to expand training to all participating Smile Keepers preschools in the coming years.

Smile Keepers also plans to extend outreach for program messages by partnering with the Tuolumne County Health Department Local Oral Health Program. Together, both programs will work on radio and social media campaigns to promote early childhood oral care and access to services. We plan to promote First 5 oral health messages at Tuolumne County Library story times, ICES Children's Fair, Give Kids A Smile free dental event and kindergarten registrations at each elementary school.

Access to Services & Community Linkages to Promote Seamless Services

Description: Smile Keepers screenings and varnish treatments are provided on site, in preschool classrooms, where children are welcome to watch and interact with Smile Keepers staff. The intent of this style of program delivery is to break down the mysterious and often fearful nature of dental services. By providing dental services in the comfortable, familiar setting of their classrooms, we find patient cooperation is much better and children develop confidence in watching their peers participating. This breaks down the barrier of fear and helps to foster a positive first dental experience. Many parents report that children tell their dentist that they "already went to the dentist at school".

Smile Keepers plans to provide staff trainings on site as well. It is often a barrier for staff to attend trainings off site or after hours. This also gives us the opportunity to fine tune brushing strategies inside the classroom as opposed to learning something in a meeting and trying to implement the new task in the classroom. Another barrier to care has been helping families with dental needs navigate the Denti Cal /Medi Cal system, especially if families are new to Tuolumne County. Tuolumne County Health Department has agreed to a partnership with the Dental Transformation Initiative (DTI) coordinator, to help connect families to dental providers and troubleshoot any problems with Med iCal eligibility. The DTI coordinator has direct contact with Tuolumne County Social Services Agency to help streamline the Medi Cal process. The DTI coordinator will be included in any referral paperwork sent home to families from the Smile Keepers activities. This service will be especially helpful to families needing referrals out of county for specialized dental services such as oral surgery with general anesthesia or special needs patients. The DTI coordinator is also Spanish speaking and can assist families needing language assistance.

Description: Smile Keepers has a long standing relationship with staff and management with the preschools, public and private agencies, and local dental/medical providers that participate in our program. The Smile Keepers Dental Project has partnered with local public and private elementary and high schools in Tuolumne County for the past 25 years and has an excellent working relationship with all parties. Smile Keepers is the only public dental health program in Tuolumne County and is not duplicating services on any level.

Organizational Capacity

<u>Staffing:</u> Please explain the staffing structure that you present in your budget. Describe the qualifications of the key personnel (staff or consultants), the time (FTE) they will devote to the project, and their experience performing the services outlined in this application.

The Smile Keepers Program Director is Erika Hagstrom Dossi, RDA. Ms Dossi is a California licensed Registered Dental Assistant, in good standing, with the California Dental Board. Ms. Dossi has 33 years of dental experience in private pediatric practice, periodontics and nonprofit clinical dental settings. Ms. Dossi has served as the program coordinator and director of the Smile Keepers dental project and lead grant writer for the past 25 years. Ms. Dossi is licensed to provide dental screenings and fluoride varnish applications under the supervision of the Clinical Director and Advisory Dentist. Ms. Dossi also provides classroom based dental education and patient case management for families participating in the Smile Keepers program. Smile Keepers serves students in preschool, elementary school and high school settings. First 5 funds will be used to fund 58% FTE of Ms. Dossi's salary. The Smile Keepers program has been operated and managed by the Tuolumne County Superintendent of Schools for the past 19 years and Ms. Dossi is employed as a management employee with the TCSOS office. TCSOS provides fiscal oversight and in kind donation of office space, etc.

The Smile Keepers Clinical Director is Ocean Arellano, RDHAP. Ms. Arellano provides clinical oversight to the Smile Keepers program. Ms. Arellano is a California registered dental hygienist in alternative practice in good standing with the California Dental Hygiene Board. Ms. Arellano provides dental screenings, fluoride varnish application, dental education and patient referral on a part time basis for the Smile Keepers school based program. Ms. Arellano also maintains a position in private practice in Tuolumne County and has extensive experience with public dental clinical care through her participation in a project with Tuolumne County Behavioral Health and multiple international dental mission expeditions. Ms. Arellano is a contractual employee at this time.

The Advisory Dentist is Larry Moe, DDS. Dr. Moe acts as the volunteer advisory dentist to the Smile Keepers program and provides the fluoride prescription for the Smile Keepers program in Tuolumne County. Dr. Moe is also a member of the Smile Keepers Oral Health Advisory

Committee/Head Start Advisory Board and serves as program advisor to the Program Director when needed. Dr. Moe is a licensed dentist in the State of California, in good standing. Dr. Moe has a private dental practice in Sonora, California and has been in practice for the past 30 years.

The Dental Consultant This new position will be included in this grant. This consultant will assist with program trainings and implementation of dental hygiene practices in targeted preschool settings. The consultant will also be required to have early childhood education and experience. The consultant will work on a contractual hourly basis to be named in the budget.

Budget Narrative: Leveraging

What resources will you be able to leverage to assist you in providing and sustaining the services described in this application over the four years of operation? The Smile Keepers program has been housed and managed by the Tuolumne County Superintendent of Schools office for the past 19 years. TCSOS provides fiscal and program oversight and provides in kind support such as office space, phone, etc. Smile Keepers is an entirely grant funded program and must seek funding on a consistent basis for program survival. Smile Keepers has many funding sources for the school based program (kindergarten through high school) such as grants and donations, which provide program stability. Smile Keepers receives donations from each school district, Black Oak Casino, Omega Nu, Black Hat Foundation, Delta Dental Foundation, Sonora Area Foundation, Sierra Study Club and First 5 Tuolumne County. First 5 funds are targeted for use in the 0-5 Smile Keepers population.

Smile Keepers is requesting \$\$232,636 in salary and benefits for the Program Coordinator .58% FTE, over the 4-year grant period. Duties will include: providing dental screenings and fluoride varnish applications for preschool children with parental permission. Follow up is provided for children needing dental care. The program coordinator also coordinates all school visits and community activities provided by the program.

Contractor position will help support the program coordinator by providing follow up support to preschool staff on program implementation after trainings. The contractor will help ensure that key strategies discussed in trainings are being utilized and will help with any problem solving in day to day operation of classroom flow and design.

Dental supplies may include toothbrushes, toothpaste, fluoride varnish, gloves, masks, patient bags for childbirth education classes and educational materials.

Smile Keepers has asked participating schools and preschools to contribute a small fee (\$5 per student this year) since the beginning of Smile Keepers in 2000. This fee helps to offset other program costs and has been a consistent source of revenue for 19 years.
